Riparian Habitat Mitigation Plan Annual Monitoring Report Checklist for Single Lot Projects

Report Body:

- 11" x 17" copy of the approved Riparian Habitat Mitigation Plan (RHMP) showing the location and direction of photo monitoring points. Photo monitoring points shall be numbered.
- Photographs of the mitigation area(s) taken from the photo monitoring points. Photos shall be numbered to match the photo monitoring points provided on the RHMP.
- Provide a list of plants installed, including plant species, size and quantity with the as-built report and note deviations from the approved RHMP. If there are no changes to the approved RHMP, this item is not required. Simply note "no changes to the RHMP" in the report.
- Attach a copy of the "maintenance checklist". The checklist addresses container plant viability, seed mix establishment, irrigation maintenance/water use, and noxious and/or invasive plant species control.
- Discuss how the mitigation area is progressing toward the success criteria, when 80% of plants are actively growing without supplemental irrigation.
- If the mitigation area is not progressing as anticipated, describe adaptive management actions that will be taken to correct problems.
- Provide copies of receipts for installed or replaced container plants and seed mix.

An explanation of each requirement listed above can be found in Section 3 of the *Regulated Riparian Habitat Mitigation Standards and Implementation Guidelines* (Onsite Guidelines) which can be viewed
